Limão has received one of the Kiel Institute’s 2008 Excellence Awards in Global Economic Affairs for his work on international trade policy, which is the main focus of the Kiel Institute’s Research Program *The Global Division of Labour*.

Stephen Redding is currently Reader in Economics for the Department of Economics at the London School of Economics and Political Science. Other current affiliations include Director of the Globalisation Programme, Centre for Economic Performance, LSE and Research Fellow at the Institute for Fiscal Studies. Redding earned his PhD in Economics from Nuffield College, University of Oxford. His research interests include: theoretical models of endogenous growth and international trade, empirical modelling of income and trade dynamics, and theoretical and empirical modelling of foreign direct investment. Redding has been awarded one of the Kiel Institute’s Excellence Awards in Global Economic Affairs in 2008 for his significant work on trade and growth, both of which are areas in which the Kiel Institute also conducts its work: Program 1 at the Institute deals with the *International Economy and International Economic Policy*, and Program 3 covers *Business Cycles, Growth and Macroeconomic Policies*.




Kiel Institute Fellowship

His research interests include social interactions in labor market outcomes, microeconomics, causal analysis, public economics, and compensating wage differentials. His work has been published in many journals, including the *Review of Economic Studies*, the *Journal of Public Economics*, and the *Journal of the European Economic Association*. Lalive has been awarded one of the Kiel Institute's 2008 Excellence Awards in Global Economic Affairs for his contributions to the analysis of labor market policies. His focus coincides with one of the emphases of the Kiel Institute's Research Program *Structural Challenges for Economic Policies*.
