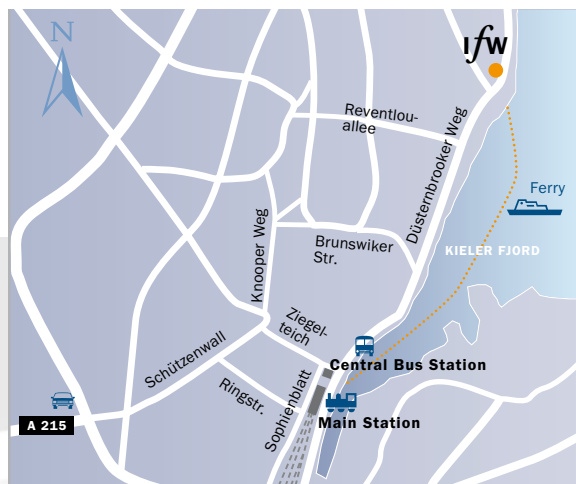

● **Reporting**

The Kiel Institute prepares replies on current, essential questions of economic policy in detailed sponsored reports for international organisations such as the European Union, the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund and the OECD, and for national ministries at Federal and Land level in Germany.

● **Forecasting**

The Kiel Institute's Forecasting Center regularly analyses and forecasts economic developments in Germany and the rest of the world. It cooperates with other leading economic research institutions in Germany within a community diagnostic framework. The forecasting centre also participates in official tax evaluations.

● **Policy Clinics**

With our Policy Clinics, we have developed a new instrument for economic advice that stands out clearly from traditional sponsored research. The focus of this innovative activity is a theme-centred workshop with specialist papers, open discussion rounds and further interactive elements.
